

Sports Premium Action Plan – St Gregory’s Catholic Primary School
2017/2018



Rationale: The purpose of the sports premium is to promote activity and reduce inactivity through high quality PE lessons/additional focussed groups to lead healthier lives and taking part in Intra School and inter school competitions.

For the School Year 2017-**2018** St Gregory’s was awarded **£21,280 in School Sports Premium**. In 2017 we retained the Gold Games Mark Status which was awarded in 2016. We also retained our Gold Sustainable Travel Award (2013-2017).
